None of my brothers and sisters have been employed by any Government Departments, Private Sectors or Companies. Though none of my brothers and sisters is working, they always struggle, and society is always there to assist my family to support me with financial assistance.

Vocation

I did work as an Assistance Church Animator for Ten years (1999-2009) before entering into the Formation House in 2010.

On January 2010,1 entered St. Hannibal Formation Centre in Our Lady of the Sacred Heart Parish on Sideia Island, Alotau in Milne Bay Province of Papua New Guinea.
